Over the past year, we have observed an increase in wildlife activity around the Club. As we enjoy our lush and natural surroundings, we encourage Members and guests to remain vigilant, especially during dawn and dusk when animals are most active.

For both your safety and the well-being of our wildlife, please be reminded to:

- Slow down and keep a lookout for animals crossing the road, when driving both inside and outside of SICC.
- Avoid approaching, feeding, or startling wild animals. Such interactions can disrupt their natural behaviour, cause unnecessary stress, and may lead to dangerous situations for both humans and animals.



As a rule of thumb, if an animal changes its behaviour because of your presence, slowly back away and give it space. Your mindfulness helps preserve the beauty and biodiversity of our Club while allowing wildlife to thrive in their natural habitat.

Recent sightings include:

Sambar Deer (The New Course):

Often seen in groups consuming plants. While they may appear calm, they can be territorial or protective of their young and may charge if threatened.

Asiatic Softshell Turtles and Terrapins (Bukit Course):

Observed crossing buggy paths as they coexist with us in our golf courses. Human disturbance can force them to expend vital energy fleeing or abandon nesting sites.

Monkeys (Bukit Course):

All-male groups have been spotted and may display aggressive behaviour, especially during periods of conflict. ■
